Carroll County Fiscal Court Minutes January 11, 2011

The regular meeting of the Carroll County Fiscal Court was held Tuesday, January 11, 2011. Members present were Judge/Executive Harold "Shorty" Tomlinson, Magistrate Floyd Bowling, Magistrate Dean Miller, Magistrate Mark Bates, and County Attorney Nick Marsh. Judge Tomlinson announced that the meeting schedule for the upcoming year would change to all morning meetings. Meetings will still be held on the 2nd and 4th Tuesdays, but all meetings will now be held at 9 a.m. The times can be changed as needed.

Call to Order

Judge Tomlinson called the meeting to order at 9 a.m., observing a moment of silence for the victims of the recent shootings in Arizona and welcomed the new County Attorney.

Approve Minutes

Magistrate Miller made a motion to approve the minutes of the December 15, 2010 meeting. Magistrate Bates 2nd. All in favor. Motion carries.

Judge Tomlinson announced that Cliff Simmons does not want to be reappointed to the water board after serving 25 years, due to health issues. Judge Tomlinson recommended Jim Lucas to serve on the board. Magistrate Bowling made a motion to appoint Jim Lucas to the West Carroll Water Board for a four year term. Magistrate Miller 2nd. All in favor. Motion carries.

Grant Announcement

Judge Tomlinson announced that the county has been selected as the recipient of Local Matching Funds for Flood Control in the amount of \$104,124 for the May 2010 NRCS Emergency Watershed Protection Project. No action taken.

Land/Water Conservation Grant

Magistrate Miller made a motion to approve the attached resolution for Land and Water Conservation Fund assistance for the trails project. Magistrate Bowling 2nd. All in favor. Motion carries.

<u>Department of Highways – District 6</u>

Representatives from the District 6 Highway Department were in attendance to present the attached project recommendations for this year's Rural Secondary Program. Judge Tomlinson recommended that the court follow the DOT recommendations. Magistrate Bates made a motion to accept the DOT recommendations as presented and to allow the flex funds to be used. Magistrate Miller 2nd. Majority in favor. Motion carries.

3 ayes

1 nay (Bowling)

The court discussed several road issues, including:

- Hwy 227, Gilgal, Mound Hill and KY 55 paving needs this year.
- Judge Tomlinson would like to redirect the \$100,000 federal funds to Hwy 227.
- An inch and half surface is not adequate to hold up to the commercial traffic that uses some the roads in the county.
- Judge Tomlinson will seek discretionary funds for Hwy 389.
- Judge Tomlinson asked if there would be any way possible to expedite the traffic signal at the high school that was recently approved.
- The Veteran's Memorial sign has been approved and will be installed as soon as the sign is made.
- Locust Bridge project has been delayed due to realignment issues but is still moving forward. May be ready for bid by next March.
- The bridge on Locust Road needed a deck replacement but only got patched due to scheduled work on the I71 bridges.
- The guardrail on Whites Run has finally been installed. There were also requests for guardrails on Hwy 36 at the County Park and Hwy 36 E at Searcy Curves area. No information has been received by Judge Tomlinson as to the status of those requests.
- A safety project will be done this summer on Hwy 227 from the high school to Hwy 42, removing the center median and adding turn lanes. Other safety projects have been discussed are the RR crossing at Sanders, Hwy 389/Green's Bottom, Hwy 36/Boone Road, Hwy 36/Indian Hills subdivision. The RR crossing is in the property acquisition phase now.
- Judge Tomlinson noted several roads that are still waiting to be striped.
- Judge Tomlinson asked if any information is available to provide assistance with lighting from the interstate into town. The local government would have to pay for the perpetual maintenance of any lighting that may be installed.
- Traffic issues resulting from the Speedway were discussed. Judge Tomlinson noted that all resurfacing is being done north of the speedway, but no considerations are being made for traffic areas south of the speedway.
- Discussion was made of previous problems with the contractor for snow removal on state roads.
- Tree trimming on Hwys 47 and 36 East needs to be done this year.

No further action taken.

NAS

Mary Jean Riley and Bill Jones were in attendance to ask for approval of the attached inducement resolution and memorandum of agreement to allow industrial revenue bonds be issued to finance an expansion of the long products facility. Magistrate Miller made a motion to approve the resolution and agreement. Magistrate Bowling 2^{nd} . All in favor. Motion carries.

Mayor of Ghent

The mayor was not in attendance, possibly due to the snow.

Jailer

Jailer Mike Humphrey presented the policy and procedures manual for the jail. There were no changes. No action taken.

General Assembly Report

Information pertaining to the general assembly members is available in the Judge's Office. The court discussed whether the state budget will reopen.

County Judge Comments

- The County's Solid Waste Management Plan is in compliance with the implementation schedule as provided by the Division of Waste Management.
- The KY Council on Homeless is doing another count at midnight January 27.
- Special Olympics/Polar Bear Plunge is seeking volunteers in the area. Margaret Walker is the local contact for the organization.

County Attorney Comments

Nick Marsh asked for the attached resolution to be approved, addressing the collection of delinquent taxes and any conflict of interest issues. Magistrate Bates made a motion to approve the resolution. Magistrate Bowling 2^{nd} . All in favor. Motion carries.
